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Principle: Environmental Health and Integrity

Supports a healthy environment through the protection and restoration of natural habitats, ecosystem services, wildlife, water and air quality, fertile lands, and nutritious food, as well as supports urgent action to reduce emissions and adapt to impacts of climate change.
